

A Licensed Clinical Drug and Alcohol Counselor, through the Kean Counseling Center, is available to provide individualized screening. Through this consultation, personalized recommendations are provided to the student.




COUNSELING SERVICES

Kean University students who are interested in counseling for alcohol and/or other drug concerns are offered sessions through the Counseling Center when appropriate. This can include individual and/or group sessions and can also be supplemented by outside support. Referrals to outside facilities may be provided when deemed necessary. Counseling utilizes a motivational approach designed to increase a student's awareness and self-reflection concerning their alcohol and/or drug use. The approach emphasizes personal choice.

EARLY INTERVENTION AND EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

Some students make high-risk choices around alcohol and other drugs that may require intervention and educational programs. The educational programs below are designed to meet individual needs of students who have made high-risk choices around substances. The components of the early intervention and educational programs are as follows:

- Choices I: is a specialized program for students who are found in violation of the Residential Student Services or University alcohol policy
- Choices II: is a specialized program for students who are found in violation of the Residential Student Services or University alcohol policy for a second time
- Alternatives: is a specialized program for students who are found in violation of the Residential Student Services or University other drug policy.



EDUCATIONAL LINKS

The Kean Counseling Center offers eCheckup To Go for Alcohol (e-CHUG) and Marijuana (e-TOKE). These are brief, on-line, self-assesments, that provide personalized feedback on either alcohol or marijuana use to Kean students.
