

#### **COUNSELING CENTER STAFF**


The Kean Counseling Center is staffed by licensed professionals including psychologists, clinical social workers, a clinical alcohol and drug counselor and graduate level externs under supervision of professional staff. A board certified psychiatrist is available for consultation if it appears medication could be helpful. Psychiatric services are available only to students who are actively involved in ongoing treatment with one of our counselors.

#### **ELIGIBILITY FOR SERVICES**

Our services are available for enrolled students of Kean University at no additional cost. Please note, Kean employees, even those who are also students, must utilize the mental health services provided through the university's Employee Assistance Program (EAP). For questions or to access services, contact Human Resources at 908-737-3300. If you have questions regarding which services are appropriate for you, call the counseling center at 908-737-4850.

#### CONFIDENTIALITY

All records of the Kean Counseling Center are private and confidential. When a student comes to the counseling center, the information gathered does not become part of a permanent university record. It does not appear on any transcript or official document of any type. No one in the university or any other individual will be given information about a student without that student's written consent, except in special circumstances as required by law. A statement about this policy will be given to you during your first appointment and your counselor will be available to answer any questions you have.
