- A speech and language screening test (please call 908.737.5810 for an appointment on campus);
- A minimum grade of "B-" in ENG 1030: Composition;
- A minimum grade of "B-" in MATH 1000: College Algebra;
- A minimum grade of "B-" in ID 2052: Human Exceptionality;
- A minimum grade of "B-" in COMM 1402: Speech Communication;
- Satisfactory completion (with a grade of B- or better) of EMSE 2801 (Introductory Field Experience), or in the case of transfer students, an equivalent experience and SPED 2200;
- Passing of Praxis I Core Academic Skills Test for Educators as required by New Jersey.
- A minimum of $\mathbf{6 0}$ credits.

To be admitted to student teaching, students must pass the appropriate Praxis II exam given by ETS. Before enrolling for the test, check that you are registering for the correct exam.

## Exit Requirements:

- A cumulative grade point average of $\mathbf{3 . 0 0}$ or better;
- Satisfactory completion of all course requirements.

Credit for the first semester may be used as free elective credit.

## Major/GE Capstone Course

A Capstone course is a major course that satisfies three credits of GE requirements.
Each major guide sheet will count three credits for the Capstone as either GE credits or major credits, but not both.
