Educational Opportunities Center-EEO/EOF Assessment Report 2012-2013 Academic Year

Mission Statement:

The mission of the Exceptional Educational Opportunities (EEO)/Educational Opportunity Fund (EOF) Program is to provide support for access and academic success to educationally and financially disadvantaged students, as defined by the Commission on Higher Education, Educational Opportunity Fund. Students are admitted via an alternate admission category and are eligible to receive state-funded Educational Opportunity Fund (EOF) Grant. The EEO/EOF Program provides student-centered advising, counseling and academic support services to assist students in developing intellectual, social, cultural and personal goals. The main objective of the program is to assure that all students obtain their baccalaureate degree and pursue professional fields of work or graduate studies.

The support services offered by the EEO/EOF program augment those offered to all students by the University. The program supports Kean University's dual mission of access and academic excellence. The EEO/EOF staff works collaboratively with the Undergraduate Admissions Office in the recruitment of new freshmen applicants for the University and for the EEO/EOF Program.

Vision Statement:

The Exceptional Educational Opportunities (EEO)/Educational Opportunity Fund (EOF) Program offers support to students admitted via an alternate admission category that are eligible to receive the state-funded EOF Grant. Innovative activities and services are provided in addition to those provided to the general student population. The program assists students in their scholarly, social, cultural and behavioral development. One of the main goals of the program is to retain students at the University and assist them with completing their baccalaureate degree. The EEO/EOF Program staff work collaboratively with other University offices to ensure EOF students receive all the support and additional resources necessary for their success.

Goals and Objectives: These goals and objectives were created by the previous Director. All of these goals and objectives were already in place when I started as the new Director in January 2013. Outlined below are the actions that will be implemented based on the data that was collected and reviewed.

All funds have been spent with the exception of Article III- Undergraduate Grants. These grants are based on students being compliant with the state regulations and maintaining a full-time credit load.	My plan is to find out if we can fund part-time students that are eligible for the EOF grant. If the EOF grant can be used for part-time students, this would alleviate the balance of approximately \$40,000 Article III funds which was returned to the state in March 2013.
