The Criminal Justice department assesses student learning outcomes (SLOs) each semester in the capstone course, Senior Seminar CJ 4600, via three methods:

- (1) a rubric to assess written communication
- (2) a rubric to assess verbal communication
- (3) a proficiency exam to test students' knowledge on key CJ areas (e.g., policing, law, courts, juvenile justice, theory, diversity).

The SLOs for criminal justice majors are as follows:

SLO1: Understand the main principles of the United States Constitution, specifically related to individual rights and due process.

SLO2: Identify the main components of the criminal justice system, and summarize the salient issues related to each component.

SLO3: Use theory to explain why people commit crimes and how offenders can be deterred.

SLO4: Students will design and conduct an original research study on a topic related to the study of CJ.

SLO5: Students will communicate effectively.

<u>Measurement of the SLOs</u>: SLOs 1 through 3 are assessed via the proficiency exam. SLO 4 is assessed via the proficiency exam and a written communication rubric. SLO 5 is assessed via an oral presentation rubric.
